Retention – Selection – Recruitment Project

One of the major threats we currently face now and in the future is the diminishing labor pool for direct care staff. Staff turnover is an ongoing challenge, that as we all know, greatly impacts quality of care. Marklund has been very proactive in facing this challenge and just embarked on a year-long initiative to stop early turnover and improve our retention rates. We have engaged the highly regarded consulting firm of Maun-Lemke. The entire Marklund Leadership Team across all campuses just completed several days of training and are hard at work developing a plan that will be implemented in August.

At the Marklund Wasmond Center we have put together a Super Team affectionately named “Patsy’s Angels” in honor my mom, Pat Wasmond. We are in the process of developing a plan specific to our site that encompasses three major areas: how to recruit, select and retain quality employees. Without going into a lot of detail, this plan will forever change the way we operate creating a culture of respect, fun and passion. We will be incorporating “best practices” for recruitment, selection and retention into our daily operations that will stop early turnover and improve our retention. We have a LOT of work to do and this will be our main focus over the next year.

FY19 Capital Budget

- Painting of Northside Bedrooms
- Replacing the Stove in our Kitchen (I think our current stove dates back to the 1960’s!)
- Washing Machine
- Airvo Oxygen/Humidification Systems (for our residents with tracheostomies)
- Hot Dog Warmers – Temperature Management Systems (Already purchased and put into use!)
- Shower Panel Replacement
- Generator Improvements
- Vest Airway Clearance System

Visitation Policy

The Marklund Visitation Policy has been reviewed and updated. You will learn more about this in the upcoming Quarterly Review Newsletter, but here are a few highlights:

- Visiting hours are from 10am-8pm
- We understand that a parent’s/guardian’s job or other circumstances may prevent seeing their son/daughter within the established visiting hours and exceptions may be made, in advance, through the administrator.
- We occasionally have friends and relatives show up asking to visit a resident. If we do not know this person we cannot even acknowledge that your son/daughter resides in our facility. Under the new policy, we will allow a visitor to visit when they ask for a resident by name unless you opt out. We will have a form for you to do this.
