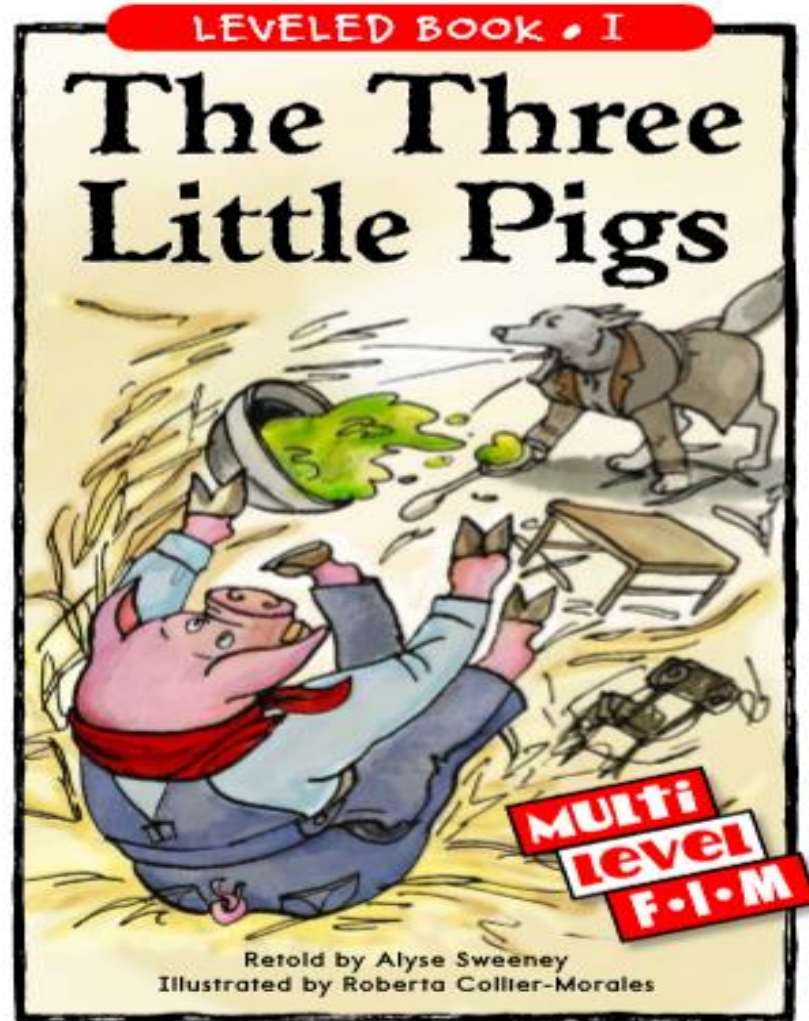


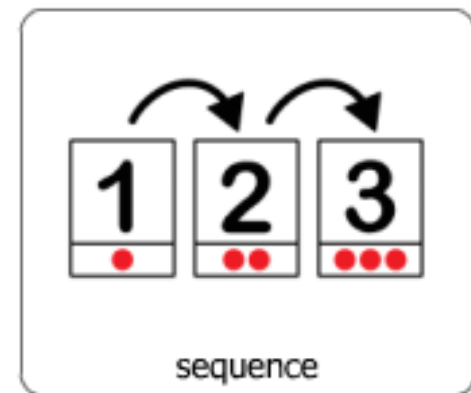
Reading- Fairy Tales

worksheet



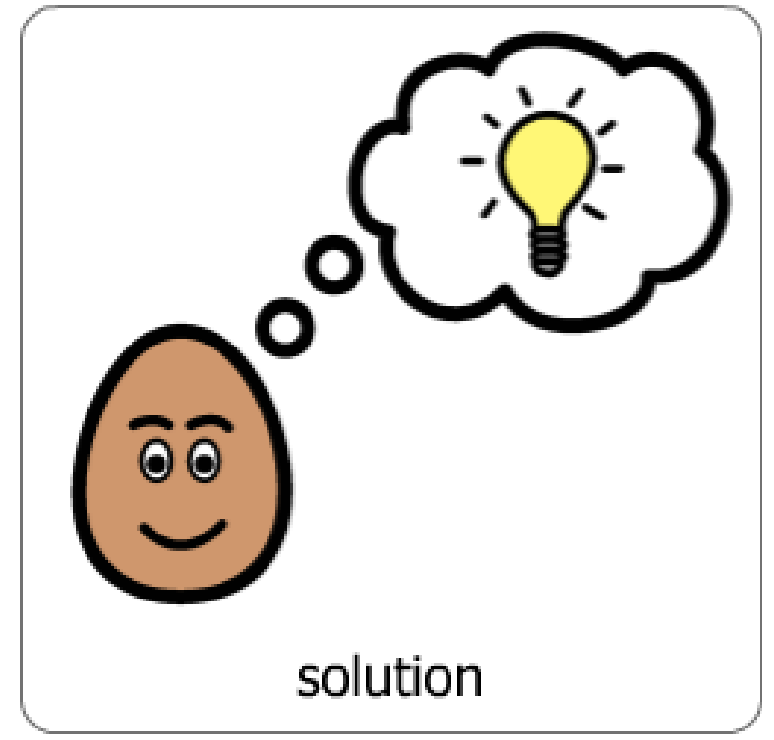
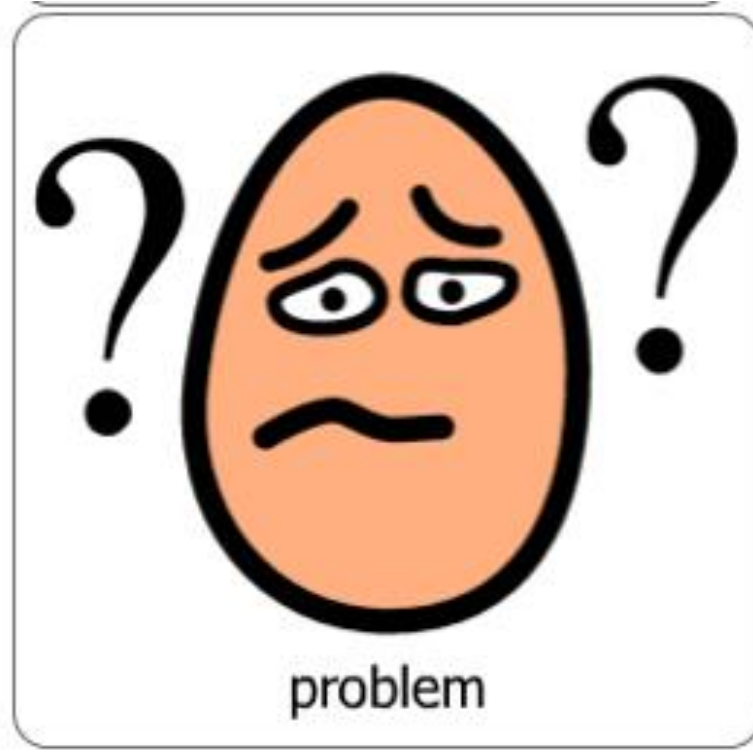

The wolf huffed and puffed and puffed and huffed and—



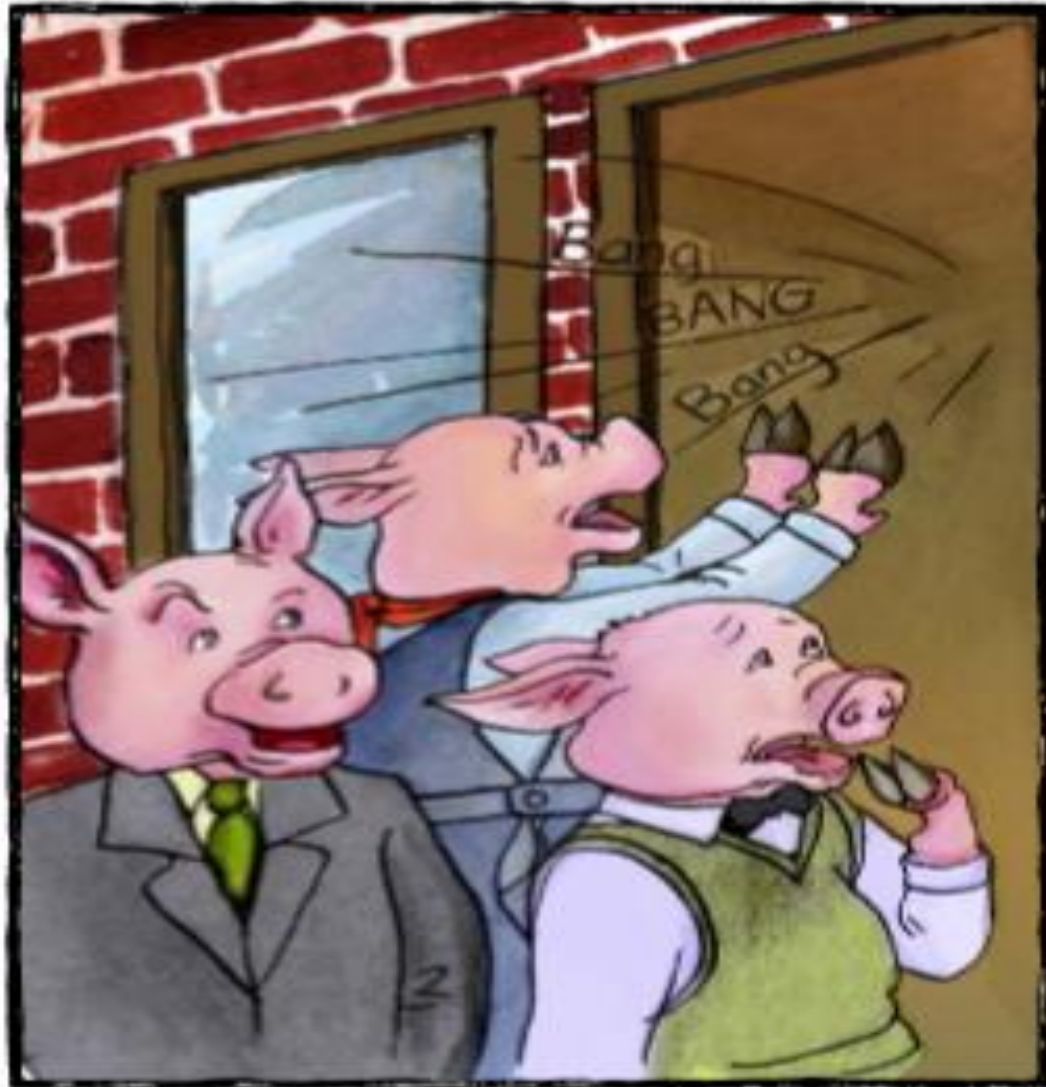
—fell over.

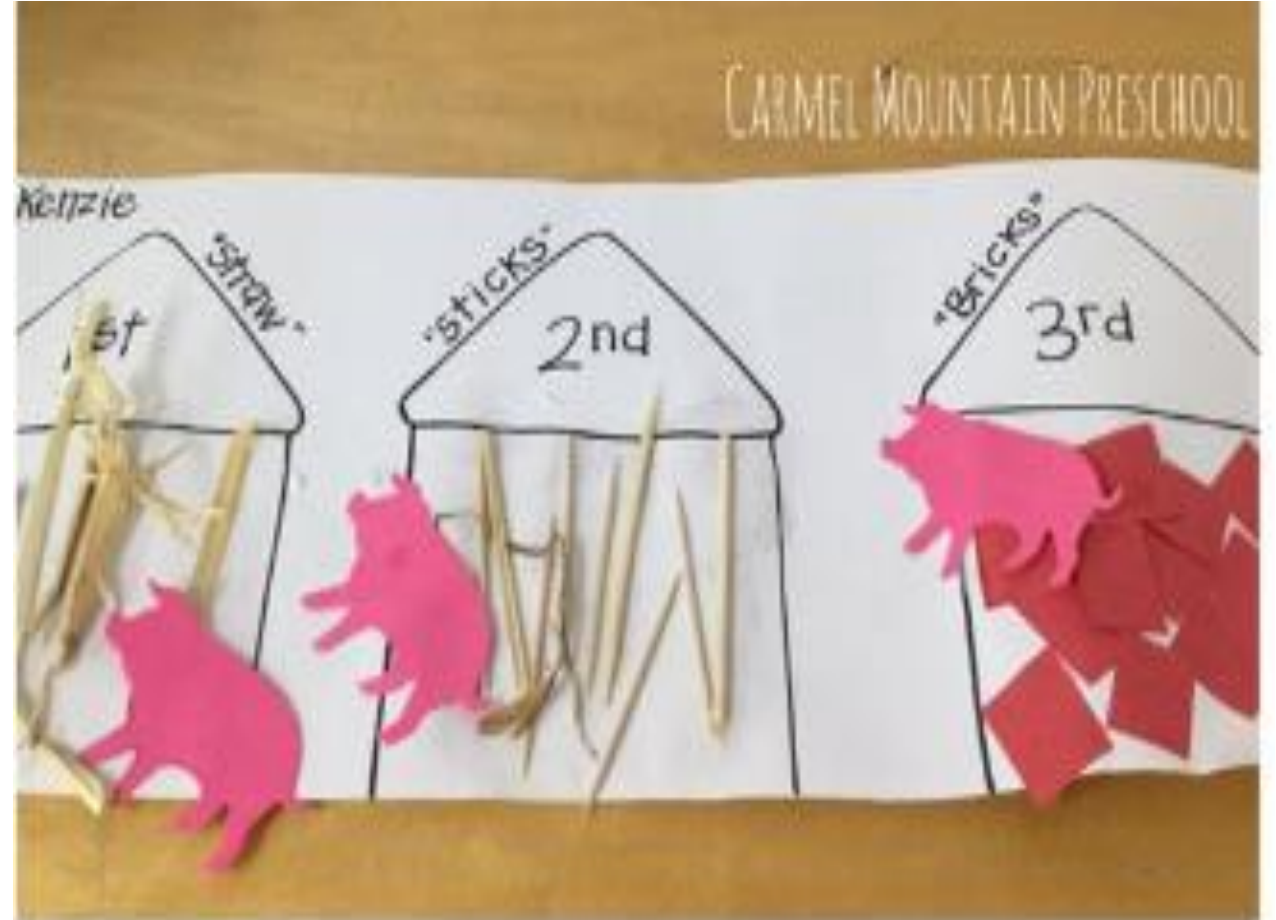

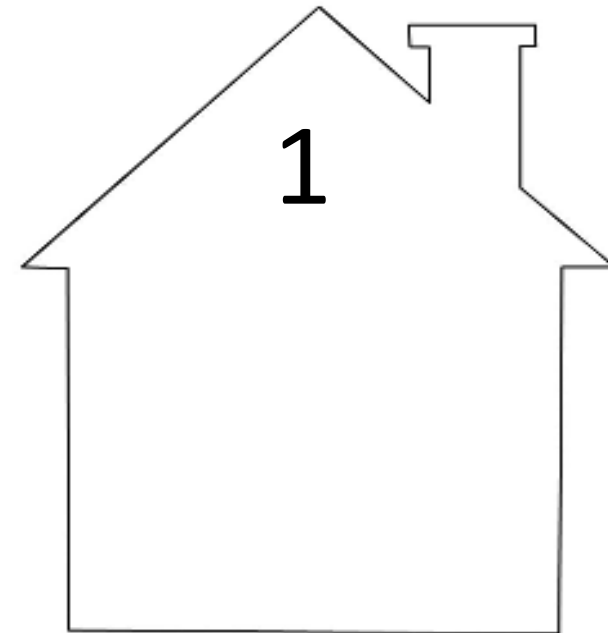

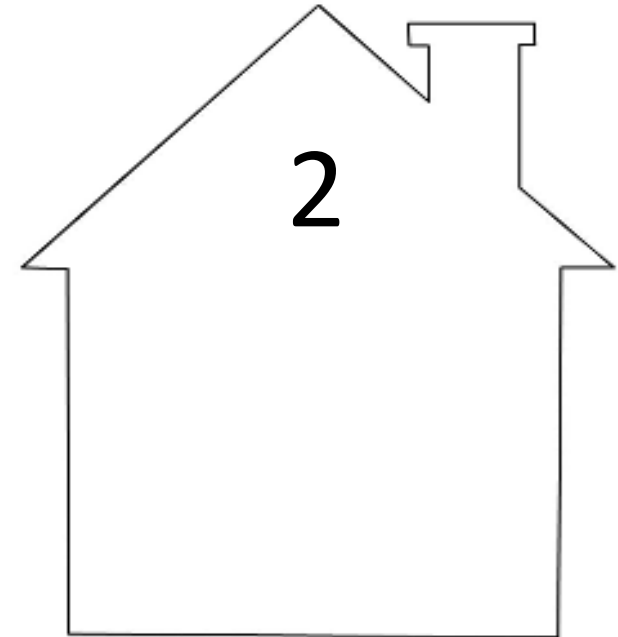


The steps for today's activity are...

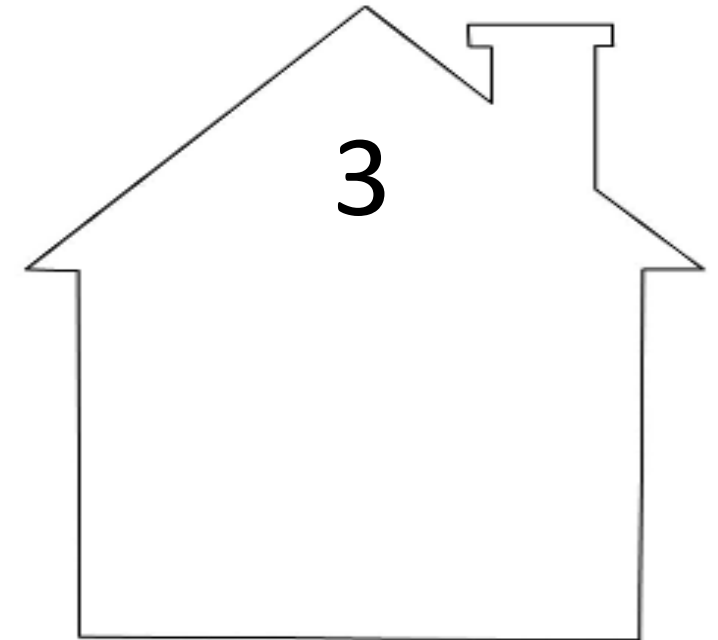
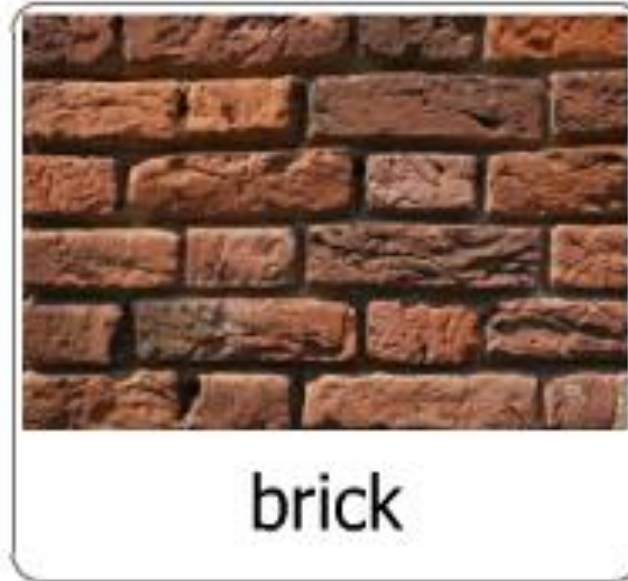
1. The first pig made his house out of straw.

2. The second pig made his house out of sticks. Glue sticks onto house number 2.



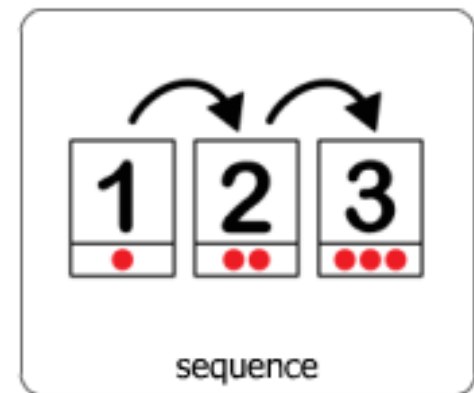
3. The third pig made his house out of bricks. Glue red paper “bricks” onto house number 3.
