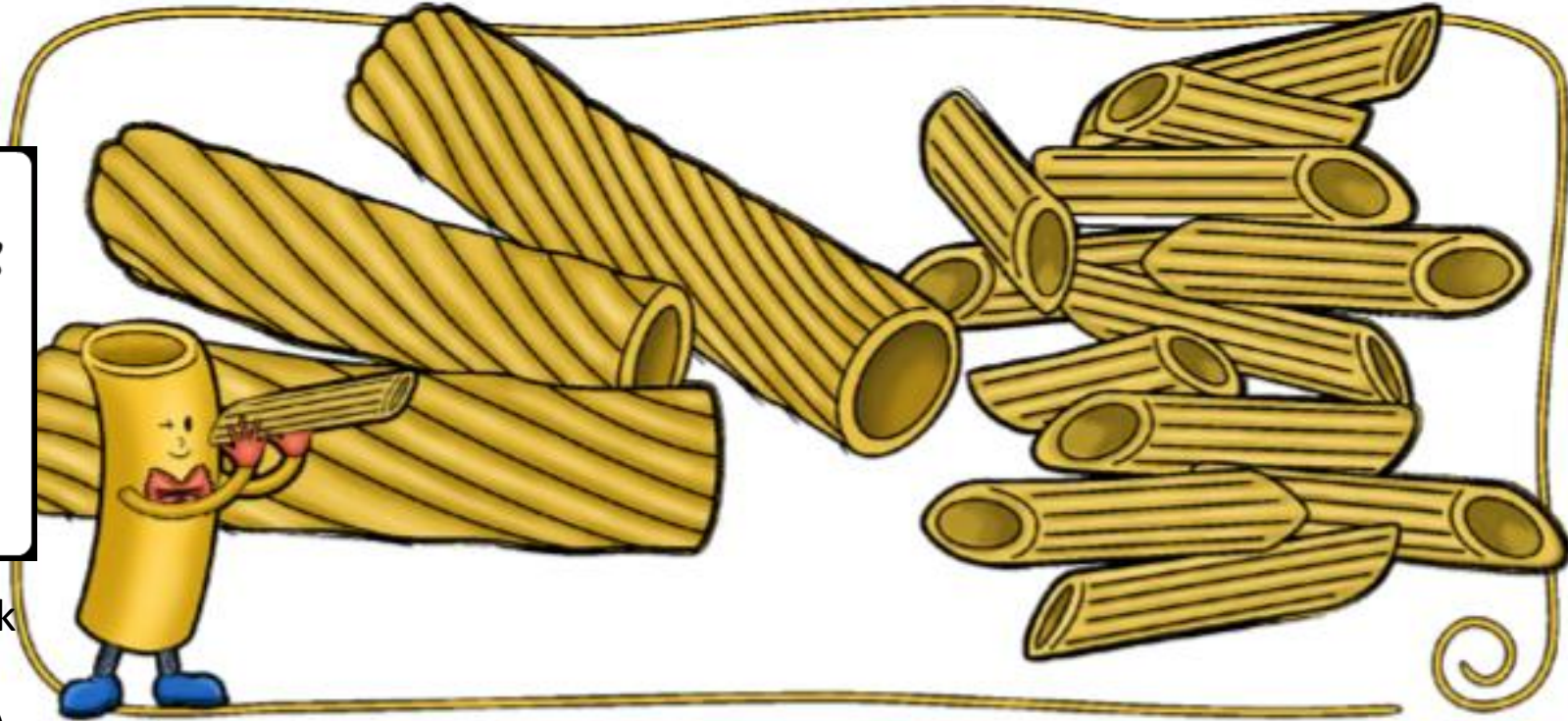


Have students break a long

Bow-tie is my favorite thing.



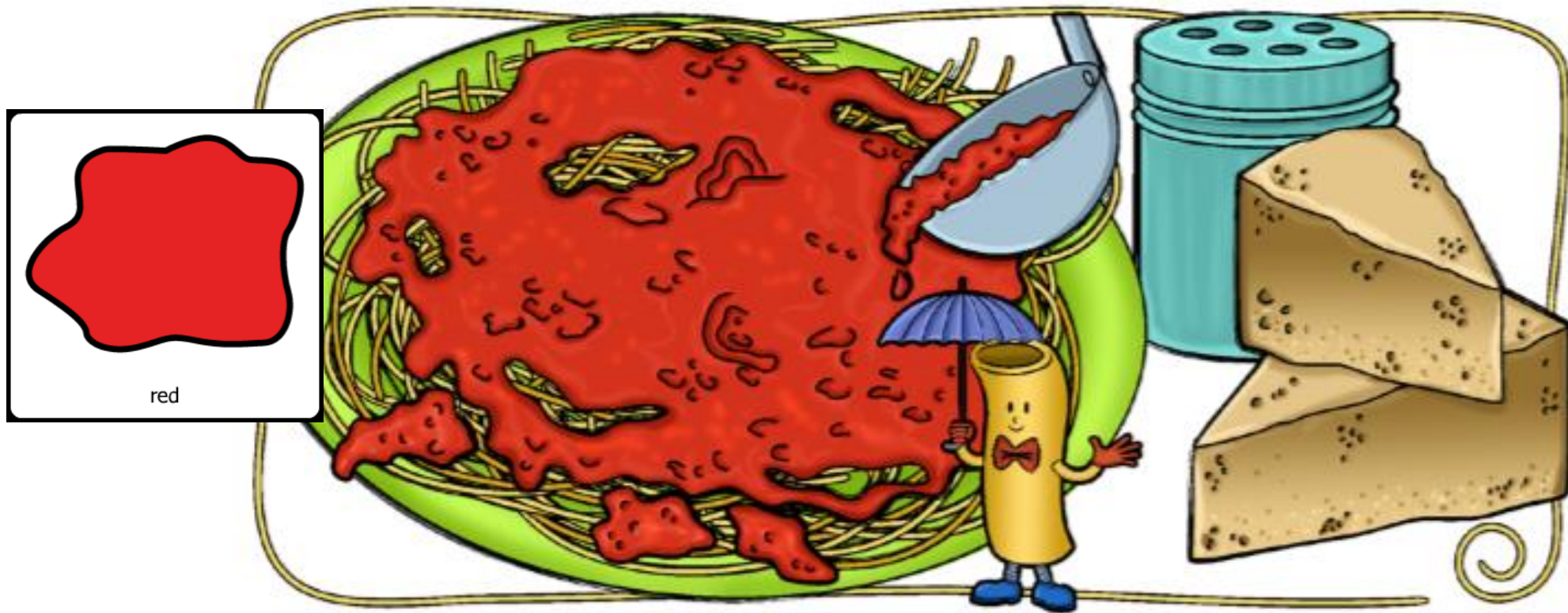
Have students look through the big noodle (manicotti)



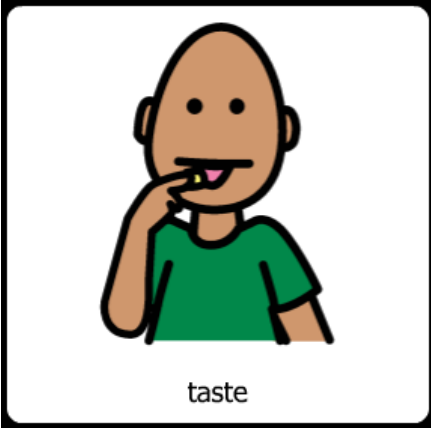
Rigatoni is quite round.

# The steps for today's activity are...

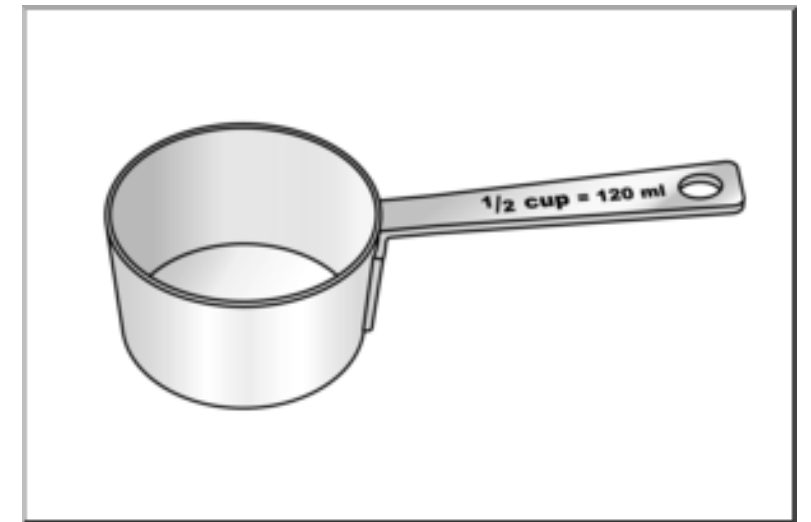
Have kids pick which kind of pasta they want to dye.





The steps for today's activity are...

1. **Pour**  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of pasta into a Ziploc bag.





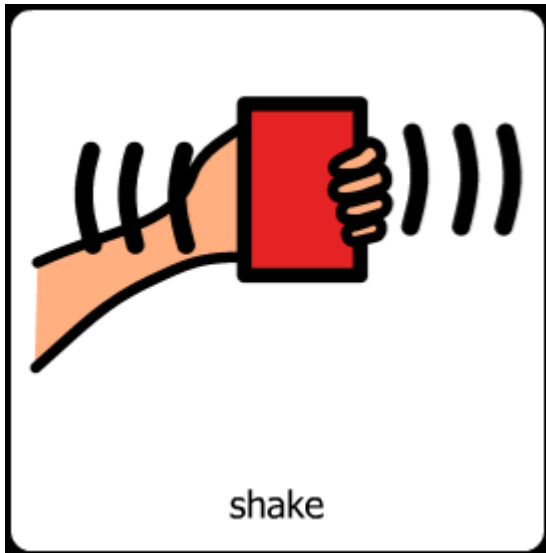
## 2. **Pour** a teaspoon of rubbing alcohol



3. **Drop** the food coloring into the pasta.



4. Zip the bag closed and **shake** all the ingredients together.



5. **Dump** the bag onto a baking sheet to dry.





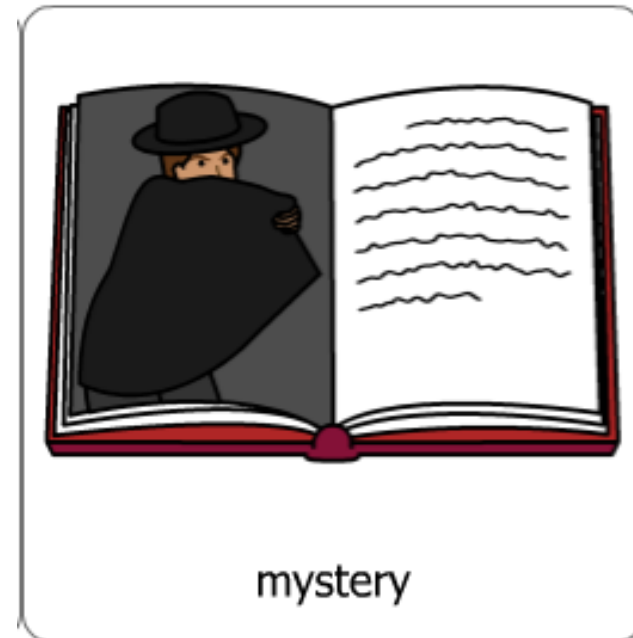

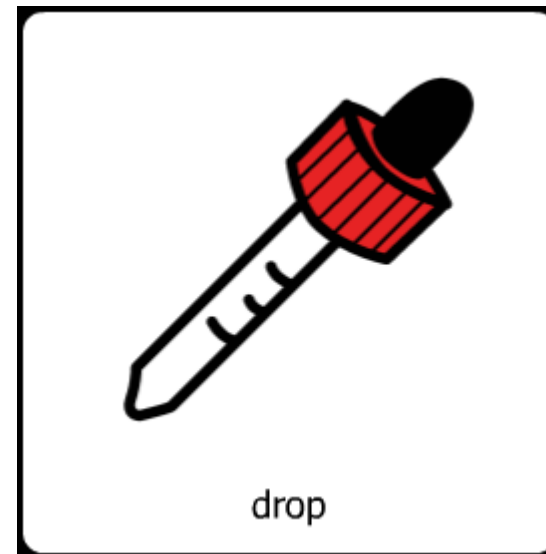
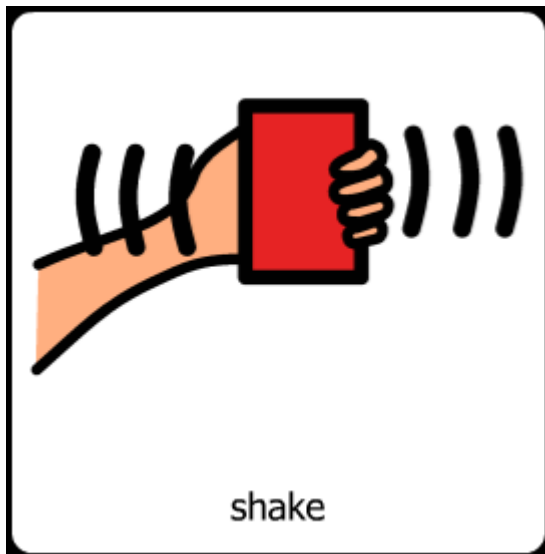
