Today we will be learning about poetry and character actions. Here are some pictures of what we are learning and doing.










3 kinds of pasta (NEED 1 spaghetti, 1 manicotti, etc..)



Have students break a long raw spaghetti noodle



Rigatoni is quite <u>round</u>.


How does penne pasta sound?




The sauce on top is often red.


Garlic butter tastes quite <u>nice</u>, And then there's always salsa spice.

By people all around the world.




Twirl the fork

Activity- Now lets make rainbow dyed pasta! *Remember we are talking about actions per step ©


We Need...

Have kids pick which kind of pasta they want to dye.






The steps for today's activity are...


1. Pour ½ cup of pasta into a Ziploc bag.








2. Pour a teaspoon of rubbing alcohol








3. Drop the food coloring into the pasta.





4. Zip the bag closed and shake all the ingredients together.





5. Dump the bag onto a baking sheet to dry.





We are finished!

 After our rainbow pasta dries we can use it for things like sensory bins or art projects.





