Part/Whole Cookie Cutting and Sorting

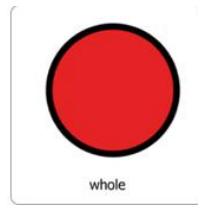
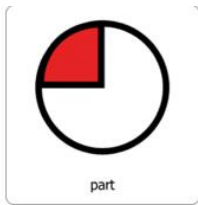


Today we will be sorting cookies using the words “part” and “whole”. Here are some pictures of what we will be doing today

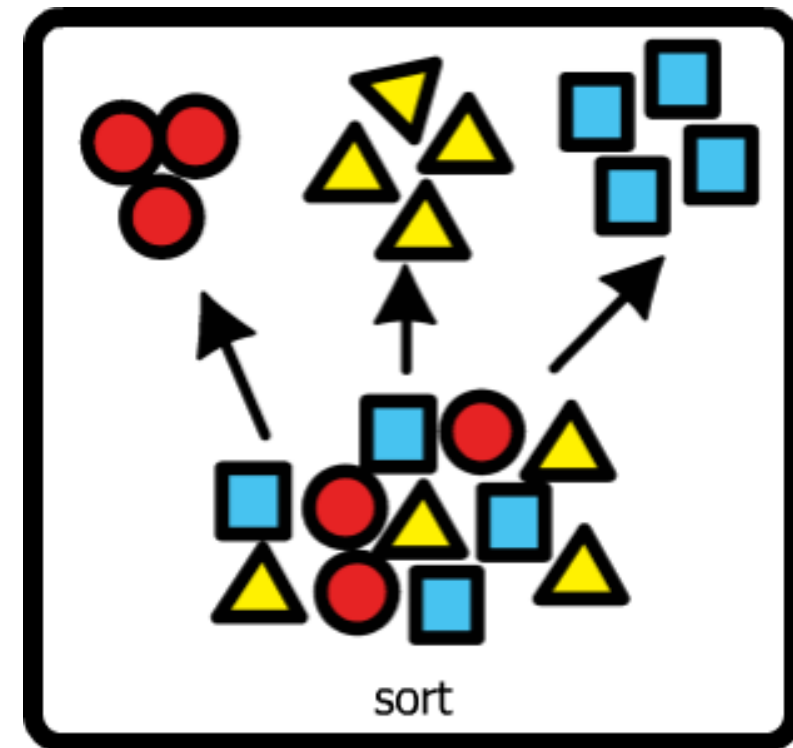
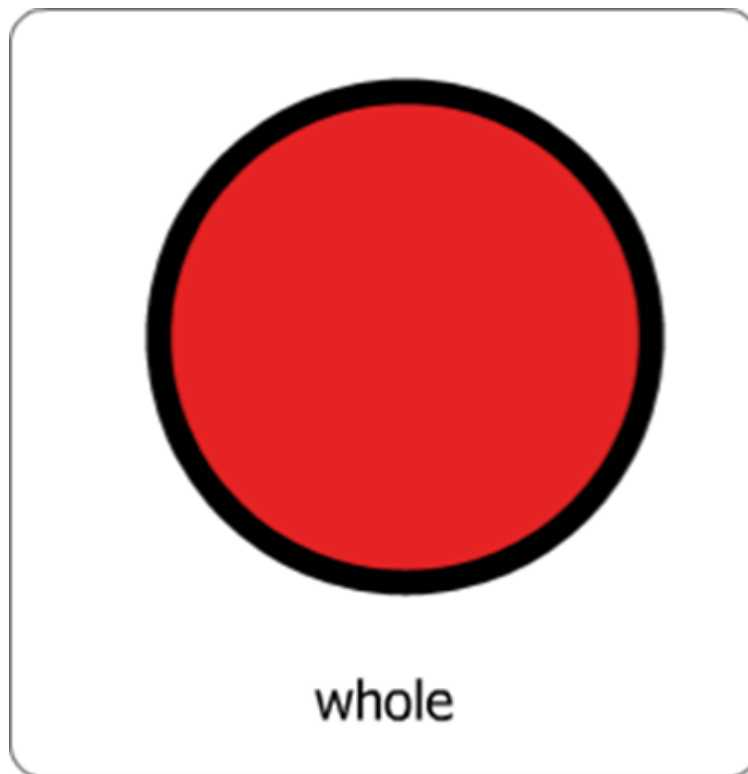
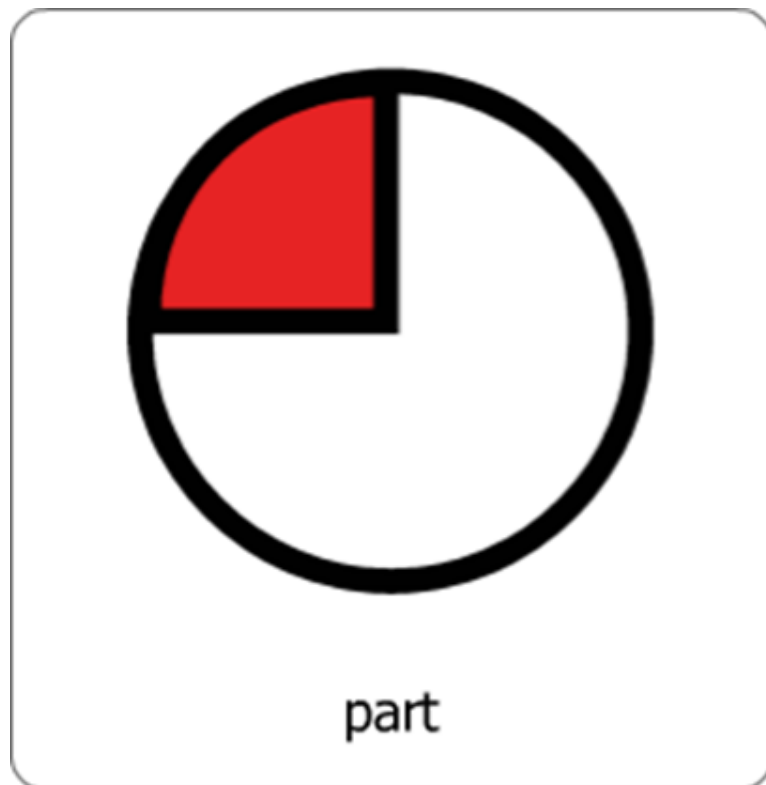


Materials needed in this activity include...

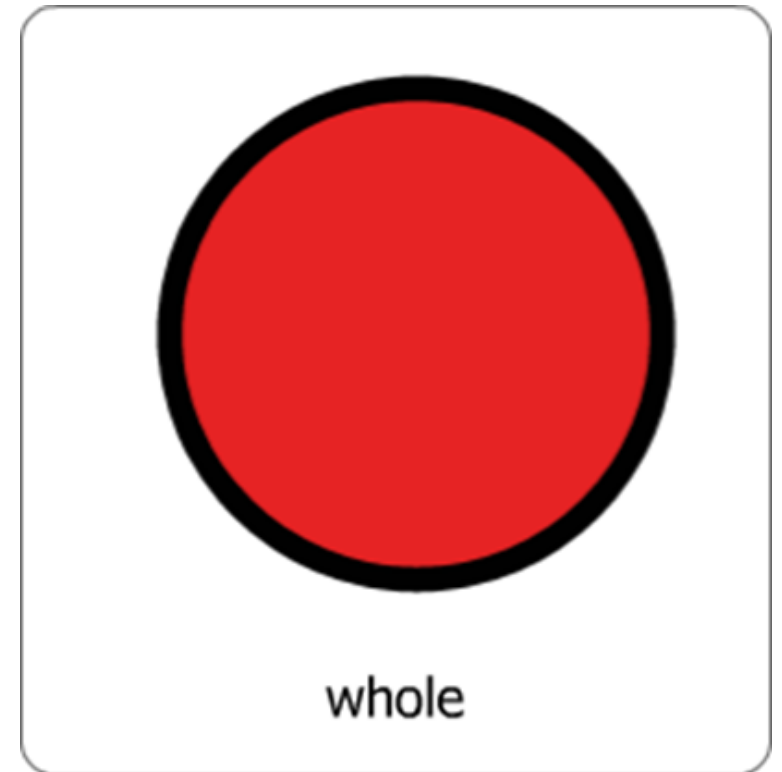
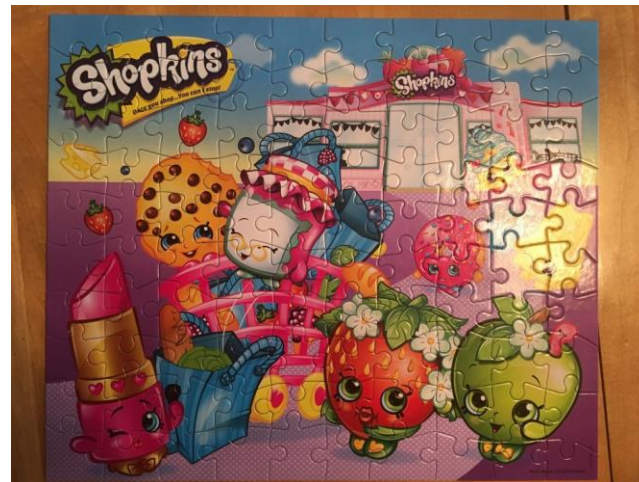
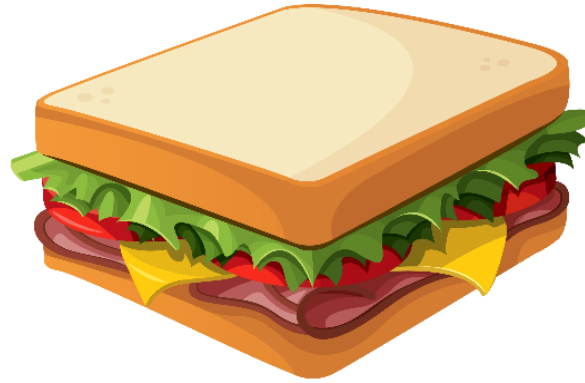
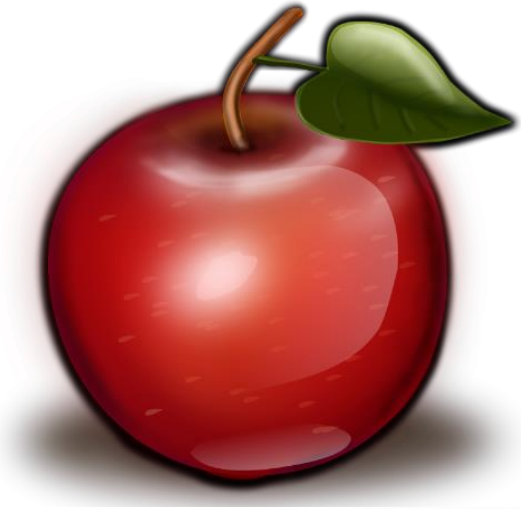


Let's watch a video about part and whole

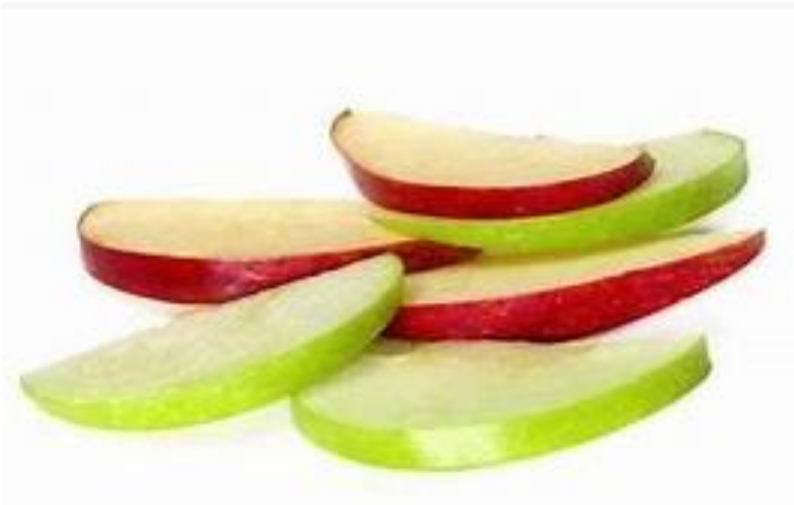


Whole means all of something.

food

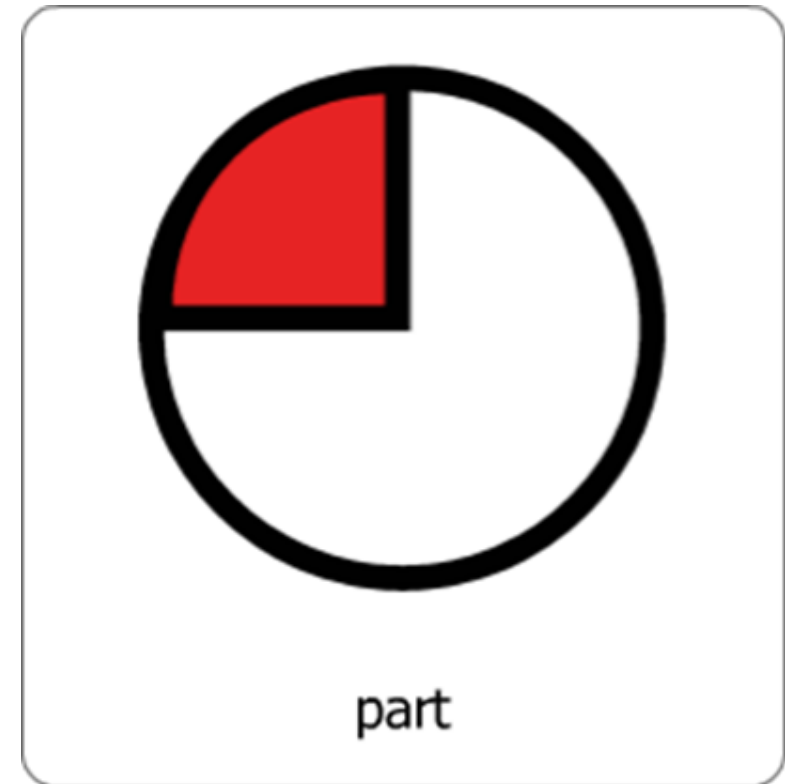
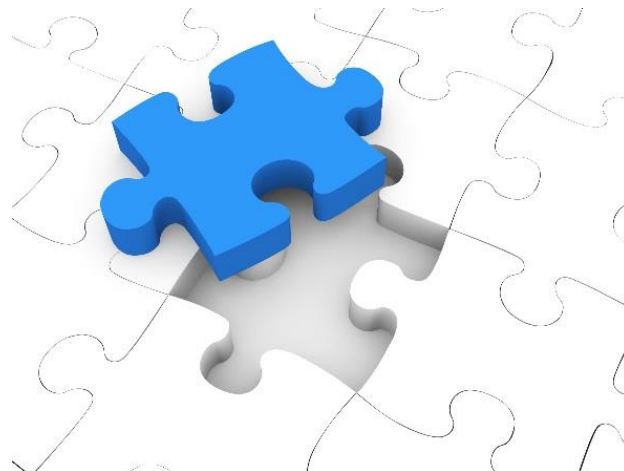


Find the pictures that are **whole**.

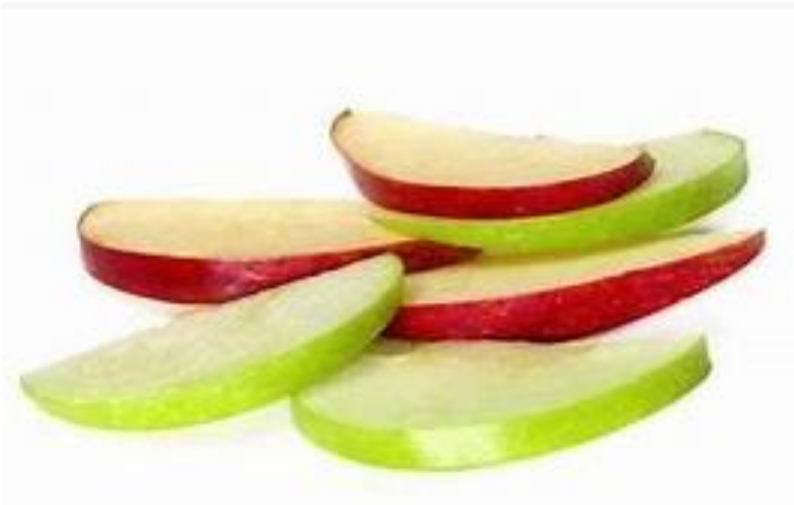


Part means a piece of something.

Activity: Cutting and Sorting Cookies



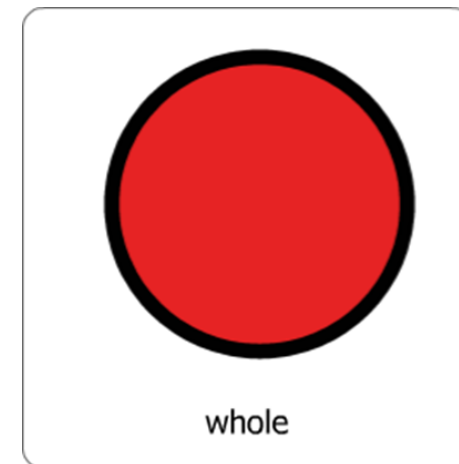
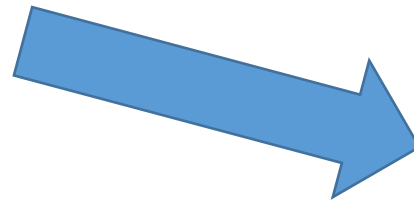
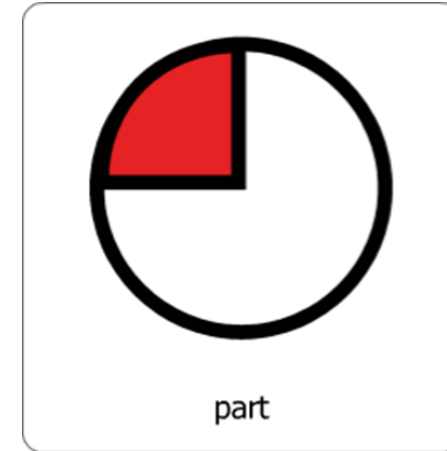
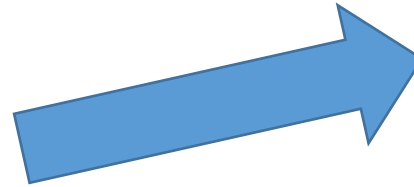
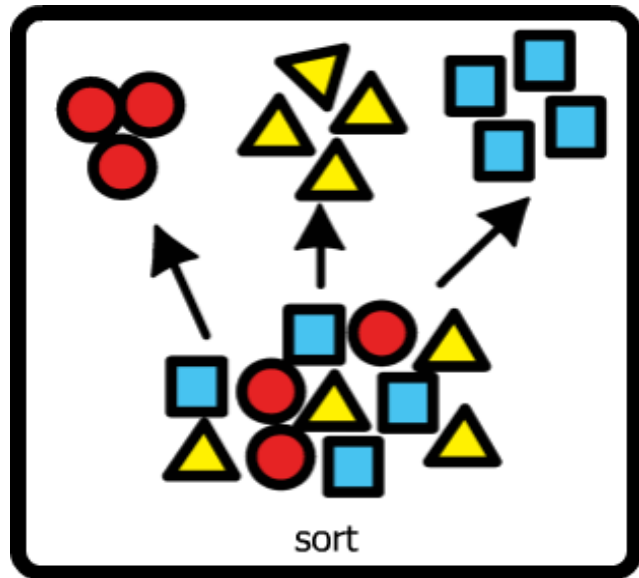
Step 1: Pass out 2 cookies, a butter knife, and a plate to each student.

Step 3: Sort the cookies on your sorting mat.

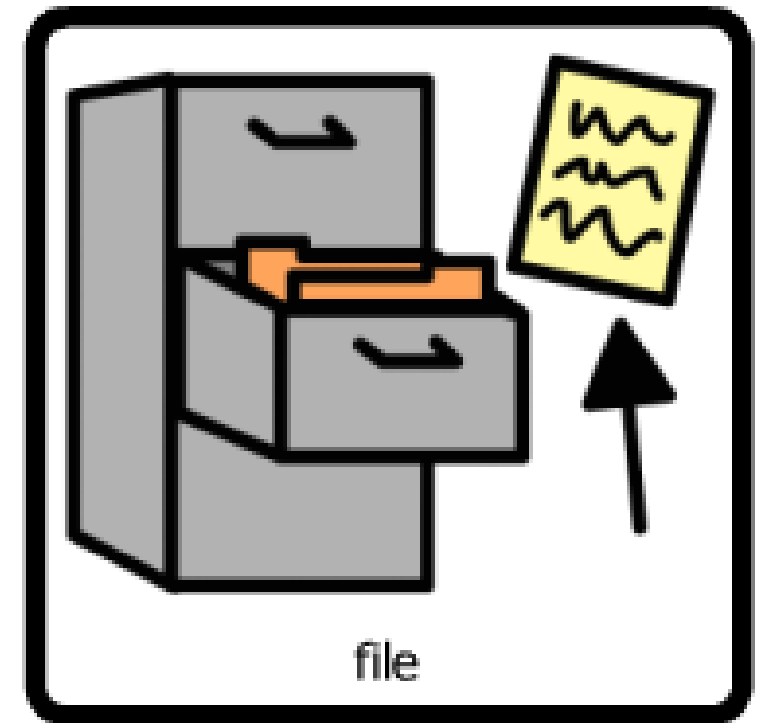
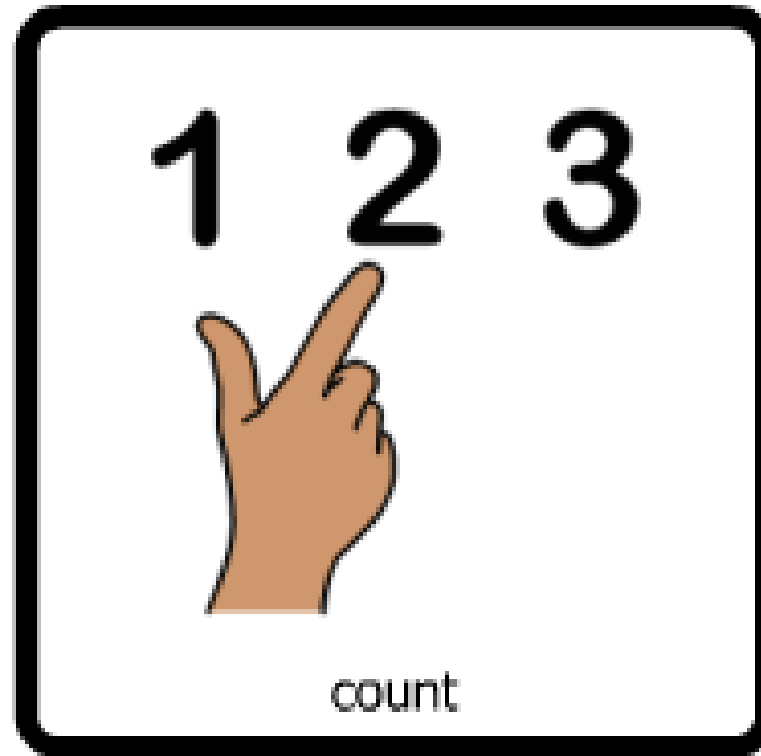
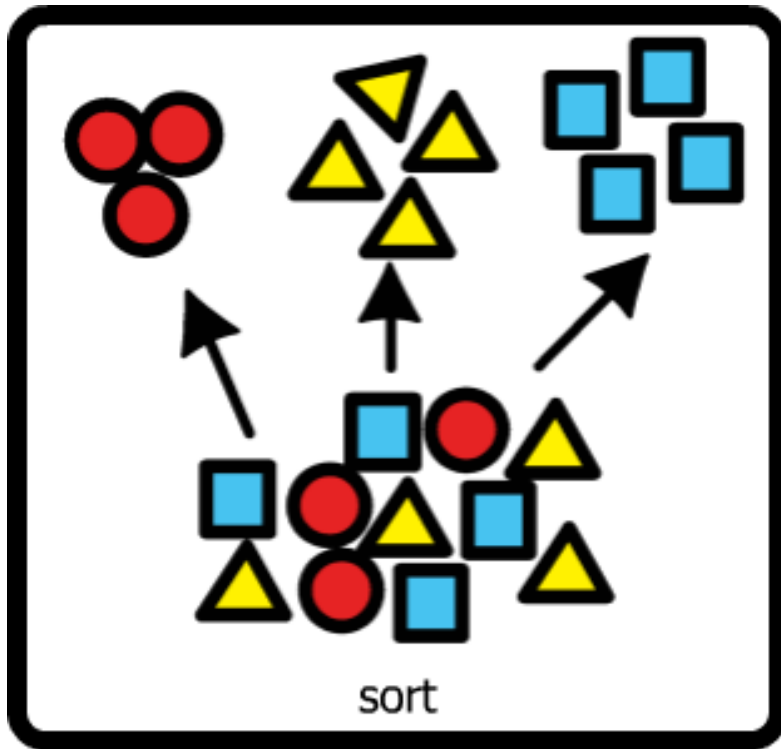


Step 4: Eat your cookie!

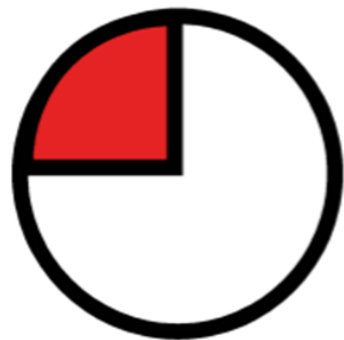

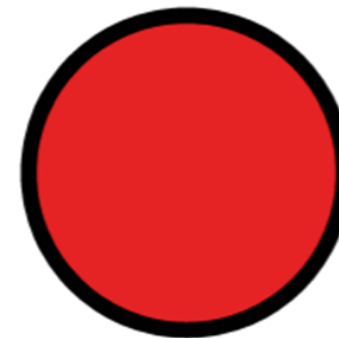
