




- Sorting mat (6 laminated or in page protectors)















Step 1: Pass out 2 cookies, a butter knife, and a plate to each student.








Step 2: Cut (or break) one of your cookies in half



Step 3: Sort the cookies on your sorting mat.




Step 4: Eat your cookie!




