Claire saw a need and she made it her goal to fill it—that was the beginning of Marklund organization eventually became the first skilled pediatric center in Illinois for individuals with developmental disabilities. Each location has on-site therapeutic, residential and educational services 24/7/365, in addition to Community Day Services for adults, providing individualized programming focusing on topical

curriculum, daily living and vocational skills. More than 500 staff members work to support the mission of making everyday life possible for individuals with profound disabilities.
